Month	Technique	Project	Tools	Description
Feb	Double Side Appliqué	Valentines Day Card	Tear away Light Spray Adhesive	Create a great card using stabilizer as the base and fabric appliqué on both sides.
March	Painted Embroidery	Painted leaf napkins	Tsuenko inks, fabric paints or paintsitsx & brushes Napkin <u>Heat away</u> stabilizer	Combine the use of fabric paints with open embroidery designs for a softer more subtle effect
April	Off the edge appliqué	Placemat	Placemat Water Soluble stabilizer, heavy	Decorate a premade placement (or make your own) with a beautiful flower(s) flowing off the edge of the fabric to add elegance and interest.
May	Free standing lace	Bookmark with Lace	<u>Dissovole</u> 4x H2O stabilizer	Stabilizing for lace requires both sturdy stabilization as well as a removable. Dissovole 4x combines these unique qualities in one. Learn how to stiffen the finished project too!
June	Embossed Embroidery	Embossed facecloth or hand towel	Water soluble topper Wet n gone tacky High nap towel	Using a specialized design that works similar to reverse appliqué we will compress the nap of the towel to created a raised/embossed image
July	In the hoop	Victorian Satchet	Felt Cut away medium Organza ribbon	Embroidered felt on top and organza on the back with a ribbon loop for hanging, help introduce us to working with non-woven fabrics
August	Frames	Photo album cover	Polymesh	Learn how to center, and size, your embroidery and "reverse appliqué" the center hole to show your picture through
September	Buttonholes	Autumn Bounty Runner	Cut away Heavy	Three embroidered (or not) quilt blocks that button together to form a table runner, or take apart and use as placemats
October	Embroidery on sheer fabrics	Scrap bag with embroidered, weighted, base	Chiffon or tulle Wet n gone or hoop ease Mod podge	Embroidery on tulle, cut and heat trim the excess fabric, glue it to a file and you have the weighted base for a scrap bag.
November	Suede and leather needles	Dream Catcher	Circle Cutter Yarn or heavy thread Twig Heat away	Create a dream catcher by embroidering on suede and suspending it in the center of your dream catcher (or American mandella)
